<u>Anti-Social Behaviour on Our School</u> Playground

The school playground is becoming the chosen area for young people to hang out in during the evenings and the afternoons over the weekends and school holidays. I have reported their behaviour to the Police on four different occasions over the past week. So far, the police have failed to respond in person. I would like you all to be vigilant if you are around the school in the evenings and report anyone who is trespassing on the school premises to 101 as soon as you are able and eventually something may be done.

Over the past week we have noticed damage to the playground surface (scorch marks). The behaviour of these young people has included: scratching the climbing wall, climbing the drain pipes and subsequently walking on the roof, they have walked along the top of the stone wall, climbed up the stone wall, sat on top of the basketball hoops, climbed up the fences around the school, intimidated young children and older adults as they have attended dance classes, rainbows and brownies, left an absolute mess in the playground and someone very kindly decided to leave excrement behind. Their images have been caught on CCTV doing these things and these will be handed to the police when they visit school.

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
