The increase in social media use (including YouTube) and online gaming is causing more and more problems for our children which are being brought into school through inappropriate play and language caused by children being exposed to online content which they are not mature enough to deal with emotionally, online bullying, children having access to chat rooms which puts them at risk of grooming etc.

The team will also be attending both parents' evenings and will be on hand to offer advice and support about online safety.
