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# **Adverse Weather**

On Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> January, 39 children were absent from school. Many parents phoned in to say their children were sick – yet their children were seen sledging, playing in the streets with the snow (photographs and comments were posted on Facebook and spotted by staff) and even seen having a lovely breakfast at a local retail park. Of the 39 children absent on Wednesday, only one remained absent on Thursday and only 5 were ill on Tuesday.

Some parents made the decision to keep their children off because they didn't know whether school was open or closed. If I take the decision to close the school, parents will be notified by a spider message, an emergency message posted on the school website and a post on the 'Discuss Newhey and Milnrow' Facebook page. The only time school will close in adverse weather is if there are not enough staff to cover the classes and the local main roads are closed. All the school staff, that were expected in school on Wednesday made it to work and most were on time.

All absences on Wednesday will be recorded as unauthorised – unless there is proof of illness (previous to and post Wednesday absence, medication, doctor's note etc).

#### **Head lice**

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There are a number of children in school with head lice. It is important that all long hair is tied up and all children have their hair checked and treatment applied if necessary over the weekend. The best method to eradicate this problem is to use the' wet combing method' on a weekly basis. The only way to get rid of head lice is for everyone to take responsibility for their children by checking regularly and treating accordingly. School can only inform parents. If parents choose to ignore our messages, there is not a lot we can do.

#### **FROST**
