Our theme this half term is 'From Lent to Easter'

The next couple of weeks focus on God's Kingdom. We started by finding watching the coronation of King Charles II and talking about the symbols of power. This led t a discussion about leadership and the qualities needed to be a good monarch. We linked the symbols within a coronation to those that Jesus was given – a crown of thorns (crown), the cross (throne), donkey (not a war horse) and shepherd's crook (I am the good shepherd). We used passages from Th Bible (Isaiah 11:5, Mark 9:33-35 and Matthew 13:44) to help us understand more about Jesus as a king and God's Kingdom.

Attendance

Regular attendance at school is really important. Children who miss school regularly don't make as much progress and they often struggle with friendships.

If your child is ill, you must **notify the school** as soon as possible on **the first day of absence and each day thereafter.**

Any unreported absence will be marked as unauthorised until notification is given. We may ask for evidence of child's illness before we will authorise the absence. Home visits will take place if children are missing school and no contact has been made.

Parents of children with more than 5 days unauthorised absence in any 10-week period may be issued a fixed penalty notice. This is a fine of £80 per child per parent. The same as it is for holidays during term time.
