Parking



Parking has been a problem around school this week, making it dangerous for all of our children. As I have already mentioned there have been several near misses because the adults bringing and collecting children from school feel that they need to park as closely to the school gates as possible – all without a thought for safety.

There are plenty of places to park near school – they just require a little bit of a longer walk!

I have politely requested that you do not use the school car park between 8.00am and 4.00pm to allow staff access. This is a private car park, for which school has to purchase parking permits for staff. It has been brought to my attention, that when staff have approached parents/grandparents about parking there, they have been met with a rude reception. This will not be tolerated. Any adult being abusive towards staff will be banned from the premises.

<u>Social Media – Tiktoc</u>

All children from year 4, 5 and 6 have been given leaflets about the app TikToc. It has been brought to my attention by D.C. Hayfield, who works within the complex safeguarding team in Rochdale, specialising in exploitation cases that TikToc leaves children exceedingly vulnerable to grooming and exposes them to inappropriate content – even on the highest level of privacy settings. I have viewed the app myself and I am horrified at the sexual nature of a lot of the content, the language that is used and the ease of accessibility that the children have. These videos automatically appear when the app is accessed. I know I would not want my primary aged child exposed to the disgusting content that is available to view. I am writing individually to the parents of the children I know have access to this app to make them fully aware of the content that their child is viewing.

Exposure to such content does have a big impact on the mental health of young people and their behaviour.

Notes from the Office
