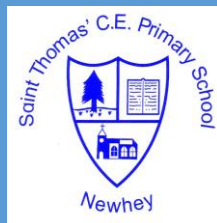

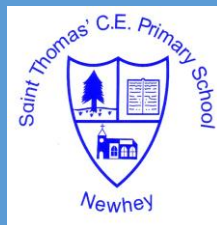

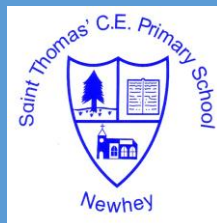

Warmer Weather

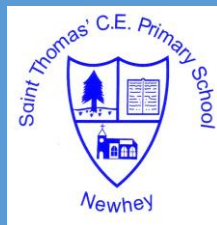


As we approach the summer months, we hope for warmer and drier weather!

Children are able to wear school uniform style shorts (grey or black) or blue and white checked dresses as an alternative to the normal school uniform. Please make sure names are on jumpers and cardigans, as this is the time of year when children are most likely to take them off.

Children can wear a sun hat or cap and are encouraged to do so, as we have very little shade on our playground. However, sunglasses should stay at home, unless there is a medical reason for the wearing glasses on the playground gives an added risk of facial injury.

We have a large number of jumpers, cardigans and PE jackets in school with no names on. If your child is missing an item of clothing, please call into school to check the lost property.

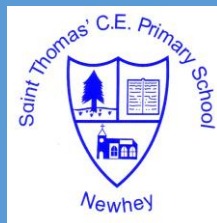
Year 6 Tests
