# Applying for a Secondary School Place



Applications are now open for the parents of year 6 children to apply for a secondary school place. Applications need to be made online via your council's website.

Families who live in Oldham, must use Oldham council's application form, even if you are applying for Rochdale schools.

Please put as many schools in order of preference as you can on the form. If you only put one or two and the application is unsuccessful, your child will be sent to the school with the nearest available space after all other applications have been considered.

The closing date for all secondary applications is the 31st October 2025.

Applications received after this date, will be considered late and they will be processed after all of those

received on time have been allocated places.

We advise all of our parents to visit as many schools as they can in order to make an informed choice.

# Applying for a Primary School Place



The application process is now open for parents of a child needing a primary school place in September 2026. The closing date is the 15<sup>th</sup> January 2026.

We will be holding our open days on: Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> October at 2.00pm and 5.30pm and Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> November at 5.30pm.
