Illness – Christmas Holiday arrangements

Thank you all for your continued support and understanding as we continue to deal with coronavirus.

Please report any new illnesses over the weekend to school via email to rwilliams@stthomasnewhey.co.uk

It is important that everyone understands the guidance around illness.

If a child presents with any of the main three symptoms in school, they will be sent home and asked to follow self-isolation guidance and book a test. Siblings of these children will also be sent home in accordance with guidance.

In classes where a child or staff member has shown symptoms and been sent home (or not arrived in school if symptoms develop overnight) letters will be sent to parents informing them of a suspected case. School carries on as normal, unless a positive test result is confirmed.

If a positive test result is confirmed, the school will work with the Local Authority and Public Health to determine close contacts of the positive person. It is at this point that parents will be informed and bubble closures may happen, depending on the outcomes of the track and trace process.

Close contacts are tracked over the 48 hour period before symptoms developed in the positive person.

It is important that parents work with the school to keep us informed of illness and those isolating due to household members showing symptoms.

It is all quite complex, so if you do have any questions, do not hesitate to contact the school and we will answer your questions.

Children and staff with a high temperature, a persistent cough or loss of taste/smell cannot be in school until they have a negative test result or have isolated for 10 days from the start of symptoms.

Do not send your child to school if they are displaying one of the symptoms. This could put the class and their families at risk.

If your child becomes ill and tests positive for Covid-19, before 24th December, you will still need to email <u>rwilliams@stthomasnewhey.co.uk</u>, so that school can continue to carry out its Track and Trace obligation.

The email box will not be checked between 25th December and 4th January. If your child needs to self-isolate when school reopens, inform school via telephone on Monday 4th January or via email to office@stthomasnewhey.co.uk
